The Foundation

The Future Village Foundation was established in 2010 to support the education of impoverished children in rural Nepal.

It was started by 7 volunteers from Barclays to conduct English teaching volunteering in a remote mountain village in Nepal, then co-founded by Peter Hepenstall and Jessie Lai as NGO registered in Australia. The foundation's aims are:

- Provide basic education to children in rural Nepal.
- Provide clean energy and improve infrastructure
- Improve health and sanitation conditions

Key Achievements

- Organized 12 group volunteering trips with more than 100 volunteers from 20+ different countries.
- Supported 3 local projects to make long term life impact
- Conducted English teaching and activities to about 300 students in regular visits
- Provided scholarship to 20 students, each receives 5 year basic education sponsorship
- Provided scholarship to 5 orphans, each receives 3 year education sponsorship
- Funded teacher salary for 5 teachers in 2 projects and provided stationery to schools
- Funded the construction of 2 new classrooms and 4 school toilets, set up library and books donation
- Installed solar panels in local education center and schools to provide lighting and clean energy
- Provided free dental service to 700 children and villagers by collaborating with oversea dentist volunteers and local dental NGO. Sponsored toilet building to 5 local families.
- Sponsored Year 10 Snowland school students to visit home in Himalaya mountains after 10 years not seeing families.
- Commenced Youth Development Program to 50 Junior College students to improve financial skills and employability.
- Raised around SGD 200,000 to support earthquake relief works for 10 local projects.

How can you help?

- Sponsorship on education: USD 100 can support a year basic education for one village student. USD 200 can support
 a year education for one orphanage. USD 250 can supply a teacher's salary for one month.
- Volunteering in the Youth Development Programme: to share career experiences with college students in Nepal in these specific areas: Medical Service, Accounting, IT & Engineering, Hospitality, Teaching, Artists.
- Participating in volunteering trips: volunteers need to attend 5 meeting sessions for visit preparation before one week volunteering trip to Nepal.

Earthquake Relief Support

Nepal was severely hit by an earthquake measuring 7.8 magnitude on Apr 25, 2015.

- On May 7th, the project co-founder Peter Hepenstall drove a truck from Delhi to Kathmandu along with some volunteers from "Engineers without border". They brought food, medicine and building materials to start the rebuilding.
- In May, the project co-founder Jessie Lai coordinated more than 10 fundraising events in Barclays Asia offices. The activities included First Aid Training, Speaker event, Raffle ticket sale & Auction night, Bake sale & Family day, Yoga and Circuit training, Football and Badminton Tournament as well as Paddle boarding activity. With Barclays matched funding scheme, around SGD 200,000 were raised.

Upcoming Projects

Project Refuge

Continuing our prior work of building health post and shelter classrooms made by HDSN in Kumar's village, a bigger project is driven to work with a potential artificial limb sponsor and our local project partners; the Sir Edmund Foundation, HDSN and Gham Power. We are building a field hospital in the Ghoka valley for the ongoing care for people severely injured in the earthquake.

Class Blog, Photo Diary & E-Learning

It aims to let the world hear Nepalese students' own voices — how the earthquake impacts their life as well as their tough stories about home far away in the Himalayas. The Internet supported by green power makes E-learning & E-mentoring possible to provide students more alternative learning sources. Photography training not only adds more vibrancy to convey their observation, but also helped to record the life up in the Himalayas at their home villages.

• Fair Trade Certification Project

Generating income is key to recovery and sustainability. Most agriculture products in Nepal are organic, while coffee, tea and spices in Nepal have good quality and produce higher economic potentials. We are in discussion with a US certification company and our local project partners to help local farmers set up a protocol process for abtaining fair trade certification.

• Long Way Home Project & Menstrual Cups

After the one hour TV documentary was completed in 2015, a bigger filming project with 25 crew from the UK will trek with the students to the Himalayas to document how precious an education opportunity could be - by scarifying of not seeing family for 10 years! In addition to prior arrangement to teach little kids in extremely remote high mountain villages, these Snowland school students become our young volunteers to distribute menstrual cups and teach local women to improve sanitation conditions.
